Estonian Dairy Cluster (EDC)

- NGO, established 8.10.2015
- Members (23), partners (7)
- EIP group principles from start, registered EIP 2017
- Cooperation of different abilities and needs
 - 19 farms, different in size, mostly big (600-2000 heads)
 - 2 dairy companies, one dairy society
 - The Estonian Chamber of Agriculture and Commerce
- Focussed approach innovation and R&D only



- Contribution to Estonian RDP Strategy 2030, etc
- Members: EDC has to keep going and grow further

Activity report, EDC 2015-2020

- EIP principles since start, EIP group registration 2017,
- Before the cross-border cooperation as the EIP OG, we have built our capability and interactive network

♣ EDC 2016-2020, I – funding 800 000 €

- Digitalisation programme 2019-2023, II 799 789 €
- The 1st cross-border EIP cooperation 2018, with FI-EIP
 - ♦ MAVAS, 2018-2022 451 039€
 - ♦ beefEST, 2020-2023, 427 868 €
- The cooperation has supported both EIP OGs!
 - FI-EIP got new funding 2019, EDC-EIP got new 2020!
 - ICT-Agri-Food application together with SE & DE, 2020



Difficulties in OG cross-border cooperation

- Member States (MS) having very different interests
 - Interest to support own regions only
 - Problems to cooperate even between own regions
 - Rigid bureaucracy in many countries
- Operation Groups (OG) are different
 - Various definitions depending on MS legislation: EIP groups, OG groups, different requirements how small can be a group?
 - Regional cooperation versus global innovation level intention must not be seen in conflict!
 - OG ability typically is weak, H2020/EUROPE calls unreachable
- No synchronised calls yet = MS perspective only, not EU



✤ No pressure for cooperation from measure perspective until now

EDC experience: specific incentives needed

Estonia

- Cross-border cooperation partner mandatory (1 call, from 4 calls)
- Info about FI/SE groups was available
- Call was not synchronised with any others, it came after SE/FI calls
- Possible to find similar topic from 2 FI groups, not SE
- Finland
 - Cross-border cooperation gives extra points, but not necessary
 - Call was not synchronised with any others, before EE
 - * No info that partners were looked for cross-border cooperation

Sweden

- Cross-border cooperation is not necessary, more regional
- Call was not synchronised with any others, happened earliest in time
- ✤ No info that partners were looked for cross-border cooperation



How to build cross-border cooperation? Each MS!

- Timing is crucial! Synchronisation of MS calls is necessary
 - Demand cooperation in measure and offer extra points as a bonus
 - Offer higher funding rate for cross border cooperation projects
 - Offer higher max. funding level for crossb. cooperation projects
- Think about Operation Groups (OG) capability building
 - Contacting other OGs takes time
 - They need to overcome language & cultural barriers
 - Managerial skills are far more important
- Why to cooperate at all? What you expect from it?
 - Call topics for OGs: from long-term aims of EU or still MS aims?
 - Complementary or concurrent skills for cross-border cooperation?
 - If one partner fails, will both then fail simultaneously? Can other OG help? Does funding allow that?
