Preamble

The specialisation of farming systems led to the separation of livestock rearing and crop cultivation. This has mostly been driven by economies of scale and of agglomeration producing however, certain consequences: pollution due to an excess of manure and slurries, dependence on external inputs and fodder/feed, loss of biodiversity, lower resilience to climate and market changes, among others.

Mixed farming systems can contribute to tackling these issues. In mixed farming systems, different agricultural practices are associated to optimise resource efficiency, reduce and re-use waste, reduce dependency on external inputs and increase farm productivity and resilience by diversifying the sources of income.

Different mixed farming systems exist and are being (or have been) used. Among existing mixed systems, the Focus Group will work on the combination of livestock and cash crops - both at the local and farm level - that can enable European agriculture to become more resilient and environment-friendly without neglecting farm competitiveness.

The aim of this Focus group is to discuss these issues in the specific context of the EIP-AGRI – a new policy instrument for 2014-2020 that aims to stimulate innovation and seek practical solutions to practical on-farm problems by bridging the gap between the practice and science of agriculture.

The specific objectives of the Focus group for its first meeting are:

- Identify, describe with adequate examples and compare different combinations of livestock/cash crop systems both at farm and/or territorial level.
- Analyse cases of re-introduction of mixed farming at farm and/or at landscape/territorial level: what made it possible? What stopped the process? Lessons learnt.
- Start identifying possible solutions and strategies for the maintenance/reintroduction of mixed farming systems and key questions for further analysis by the Focus Group.
